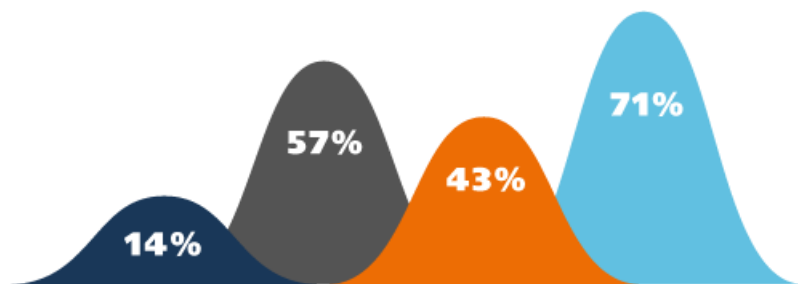

Breakfast

Vital to Student Success in School

This School Breakfast Report Card takes a close look at Connecticut's 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years and how well schools provided breakfast to students. This report also compares national data and in-state town by town data.

Students who eat school breakfast are **less** likely to visit the school nurse and receive disciplinary referrals and **more** likely to have greater levels of academic achievement and classroom attendance¹. For these reasons and more, school breakfast is important for student success.

- ▲ Higher academic achievement

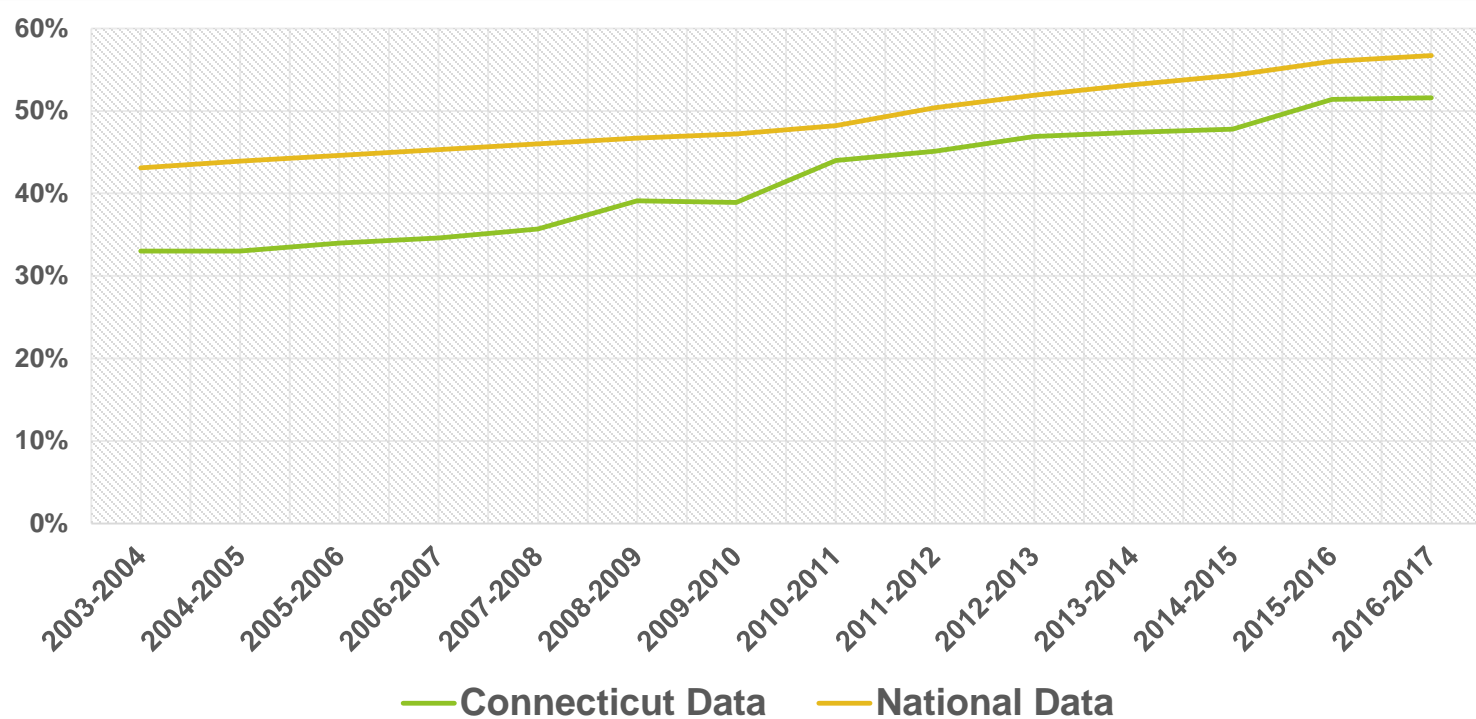

National Rankings

CT ranks 38th in the nation with 51.6% of students in Connecticut participating in free or reduced price school lunch who also eat school breakfast as compared to 56.7% nationally. CT has made great strides to increase school breakfast participation over the years and work must continue to ensure more children participate in the years to come.

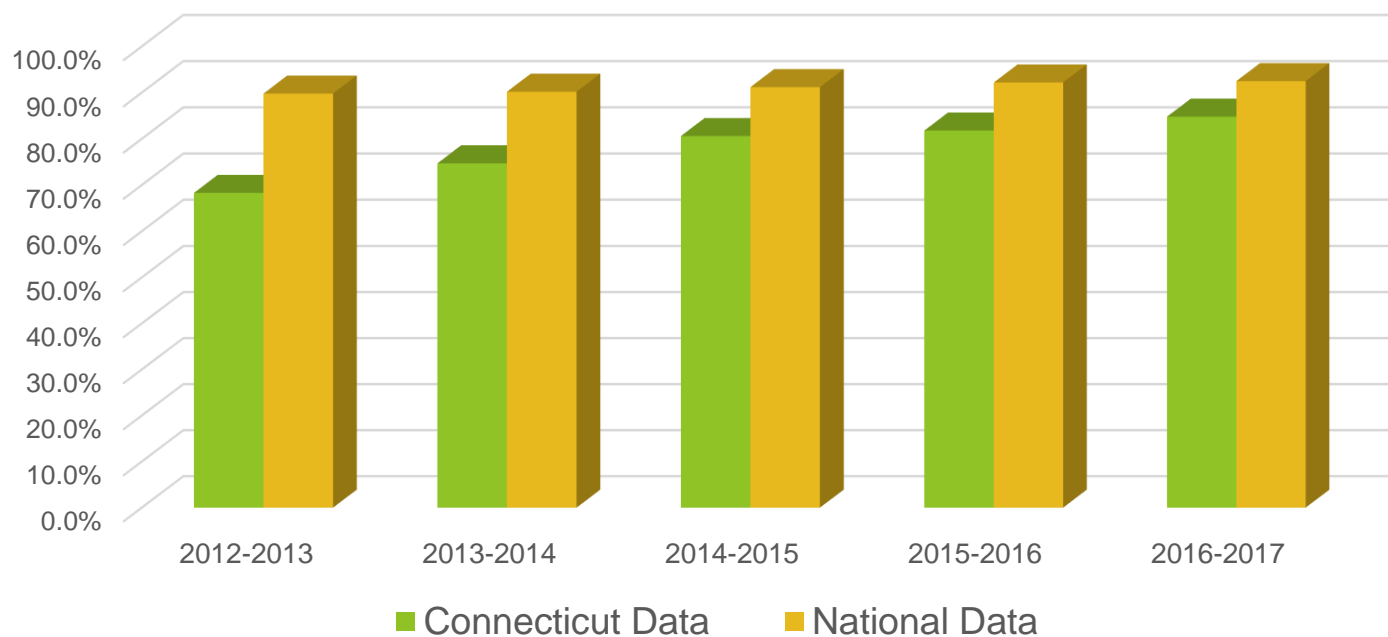


National Rankings

According to the Food Research and Action Center, for the past five years Connecticut has made significant gains in schools participating in both School Breakfast and the National School Lunch Programs, increasing more than 16%,- which is well over the national average rate of growth.

Even with significant increases in school participation in School Breakfast, **Connecticut is in the bottom 10 states for school participation for the 2016-2017 school year with only 84.8% of schools participating** in National School Lunch Program also participating in School Breakfast. Nationally, 92.5% of schools provide both the School Breakfast and National School Lunch Programs.

Federal Reimbursement Rates

The federal reimbursement rate the school receives for each meal served depends on whether a student is certified to receive free, reduced-price, or paid meals. Schools are considered severe need by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), the federal administering agency, if at least 40 percent of the lunches served during the second preceding school year were free or reduced-price.

2015-2016 Federal Reimbursement Rates

- \$1.66** for each free breakfast served
- \$1.36** for each reduced-price breakfast served
- \$0.29** for each paid breakfast served
- \$0.33** additional for federal “Severe Need” schools

2016-2017 Federal Reimbursement Rates

- \$1.71** for each free breakfast served
- \$1.41** for each reduced-price breakfast served
- \$0.29** for each paid breakfast served
- \$0.33** additional for federal “Severe Need” schools

The **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)**, a more recent federal option for schools and districts with high percentages of students who are directly certified for free school meals. Students that are directly certified for free school meals are those who live in a household with someone receiving SNAP benefits, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Cash Assistance, or who are homeless, runaway, or foster children. CEP allows schools to offer breakfast and lunch at **NO charge** to **all** students. CEP provides significant administrative savings by eliminating the school meal application process and streamlines operations to facilitate implementation of alternative breakfast models such as breakfast in the classroom.



Town By Town School Participation in School Breakfast: Overall Increases = More Access for More Students!

- In School Year 2015-2016, **12** additional schools began offering School Breakfast Programs, making School Breakfast available to **7,084** more Connecticut students.
- In School Year 2016 - 2017, **18** additional schools began offering School Breakfast Programs, making School Breakfast available to **7,356** more Connecticut students.
- This means that within two years, **30 schools** in Connecticut started School Breakfast Programs, making the most important meal of the day available to **14,440 more students** than compared to the 2014-2015 School Year.
- Connecticut towns are on the rise when it comes to School Breakfast Program participation. The following slides showcase the bottom and top 10 Connecticut school districts for participation in the School Breakfast Program.

We hope this data helps to start or add to continuing conversations around food access for students in Connecticut.

➤ Indicates districts with schools that meet the **state** "Severe Need" definition: 20% of lunches served during the fiscal year two years prior were free or reduced price. Severe Need is defined by the federal government using the same measures and a threshold of 40%.
