What is School Meals for All CT? School Meals for All is an inclusive and extensive statewide coalition supporting legislation for no-cost school meals at every public school. The proposal includes school meals and farm to school programs that help our kids to learn and to be healthy while creating equity and economic opportunities in Connecticut.

Federal and state funding for universal meals has run out, leaving school food service directors and families scrambling for solutions.



Did you know? In the 2021-2022 school year, nearly **75 million** nocost meals were served compared to **25 million** free, reduced price, and full-price meals served the school year prior.

Studies show school meals are the most balanced, nutritious meals students eat throughout the day, regardless of income. **Better nutrition helps kids thrive in and out of school.** Our neighbors in VT, ME, MA, and NY are on board and stand behind this!

no-cost meals for all CT public

One in eight Connecticut children suffer from hunger and while some of these children may be able to receive free meals at school, there are many whose families cannot afford the cost of meals for the whole school year. Currently, a family of four in the state does not qualify for no-cost meals when their pretax income reaches over \$36,075. In order for a student to receive reduced-priced breakfast (\$0.30) and lunch (\$0.40) the cutoff is \$51,338 for the same family size (Hartford Courant 12/19/22).

No-cost school meals not only support child learning and nutrition, but reduces stigmas in meal-serving patterns, lessens the administrative burden on school food service staff, and relieves financial stress for families.
